- B. Smith also highlighted the new online Ministry document *Draft Special Education in Ontario Kindergarten to Grade 12, Policy and Resource Guide 2017.* It combines many resources in one document as well as live links, regulations and resources. B. Morris and K. Dunsmoor Lough updated the committee on the following Board initiatives and Committee presentations:

- 2017-18 Indigenous Education Plan –Tina Nelson, FNMI Consultant, presented primary goals, four areas of focus, as well as recommendations form the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.
- Board meeting presentation from Opeongo Den Program eight student leaders explained how
 they strive to make their school more inclusive and positive through their DEN (Dream, Empower,
 Nuture) program.
- Petawawa French Immersion expanded French Immersion program at Herman Street Public School to address enrolment issues at Valour School.
- Student Senate a positive initiative for the student voice. Two representatives from each high school meet each month to exchange ideas, concerns and solutions.
- Capital Priorities includes Facilities Renewal Funding, School Condition Renewal Funding, Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund and Community Hubs Capital Funding for a total of approximately 9 million dollars.
